


To guide your young explorers in making their own 3D Collage, first you need to take them on a nature hike either at Woodlands Trail, your neighborhood park or your own backyard.

Give them a chance to ask questions, investigate, and make discoveries on their own. Provide them with a paper bag, ziplock baggie or any other container you have around the house that they could use to gather some items in nature for their collage.



- 1. After returning from your nature exploration, gather your supplies.
- 2. Work on a flat surface such as a patio table outside or a table inside.
- Think about how you want to assemble your 3D nature collage, e.g., how many items do you plan to use, where do you want to position them.

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- 4. Cut slits in your paper towel tube just big enough to hold your nature item.
- 5. If you have flat items that won't stick in the slits, use glue to attach to the surface of your tube.
- 6. YOUR FINISHED! Now you can display your work of art on your dinner table, in your room, or anywhere else you want to put it to show off your artistic talent.



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
