LWFC Moves Forward with Monthly Commercial Menhaden Reporting Requirements

At the September 1 meeting, the Louisiana Wildlife and Fisheries Commission (LWFC) passed a notice which will require commercial menhaden reduction fisheries to include fishermens' vessels, location and date caught, estimated harvest volume and length measurements monthly.

Menhaden are small silvery fish that possess a black spot behind their gill opening. According to the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) Fisheries, menhaden are harvested to develop Omega-3 human and animal supplements as well as fertilizers and blue crab and lobster bait.

Currently, the commercial menhaden reduction fishery summarizes their landings data to the Louisiana Department of Wildlife & Fisheries (LDWF) by monthly trip tickets and the NOAA Fisheries through captains' daily fishing re-

ports

LWFC stated the proposed rule is mandated by the Louisiana Legislature's 2022 Regular Session's Act 759, allowing them the authority to enact such regulations in order to receive the information as an electronic spreadsheet. The reporting is anticipated to begin in May 2023.

In addition, the Act then directs LDWF to annually disclose the accumulated statistics to the Senate and House's Committees on


Natural Resources commencing on February 10, 2024. As per the state directive, confidential data will not be made public.

Orleans region. These forests protect local residents by serving as a natural sponge to absorb storm water run-off, provide a wind buffer to protect our homes and businesses, serve as a habitat corridor for resident wildlife and migratory birds and a recreational venue for the community.

"With the recent acquisition of the 650-acre Woodlands Preserve property", said Katie Brasted, Executive Director, "we are excited to move forward with major restoration activities knowing the property will be protected in perpetuity for the benefit of current and future generations". The grant from



Woodlands Conservancy was organized as a nonprofit land trust organization in 2001 to preserve and restore remaining forested wetlands and other ecologically or historically significant lands in Louisiana.

the TC Energy Foundation will partially match funding from Louisiana Coastal Restoration and Protection Authority and increase funded elements of Woodlands Conservancy's Forest Manage-

ment Plan. The project will focus on improving habitat for birds and enhancing public understanding of the benefit of land protection and restoration to the surrounding community. Outreach and education via public engagement in citizen science and restoration activities will provide both habitat improvement and local involvement in forested wetland restoration.
